We have put together our school calendar for the year – some important details listed overleaf and on our website - which lists Parents' Evenings, key dates for Prelims, SQA exams and school trips, etc.

We have welcomed a number of new members of teaching staff this term, and to help you put a face to the name, we have included a page in this term's Skylines.

As a leadership term, we work together to give our Young People the very best opportunities to succeed, and we firmly believe that full school attendance is vital to ensure that students are successful in their learning. P3-7 contain some useful information as to why school attendance is important. We have been reminding our young people about this in assemblies, and we would ask parents and carers to support us in this. We have a number of unexplained absences each term which our pupil support staff work to clear, so I would be grateful that parents or carers please telephone or email the school in the morning of any absence (PortreeHigh.Absence@highland.gov.uk). We have a text delivery system in place, which will alert parents or carers if their child is absent from school and we have not been notified.

We would also like to remind parents that your child's Pupil Support teacher is the first port of call with any concern, whether pastoral or subject-based issues.

We recently issued Data Collection Forms for you to update and we are grateful to those who have returned them so promptly. Could I please remind those who have not yet returned them to do so as soon as possible?

Parents and carers are also encouraged to apply for assistance with school meals and clothing if they are eligible. The allowance goes directly into your child's canteen account and it is a completely anonymous process (please note that if you were in receipt of this allowance previously, you will need to reapply each year). I would encourage you to apply if you are eligible- the amount of Pupil Equity Funding the school receives (which funds our Numeracy and Literacy Support Programmes) is determined by the levels of free school meals provided.

When you don't attend school regularly, your chances of success are significantly reduced in later life



HOW CAN PARENTS/ CARERS HELP?

- Establish a good routine in the mornings and evenings so your child is prepared for the school day ahead.
- Make sure your child goes to school regularly and follows the school rules.
- Ensure your child arrives at school on time not late.
- Arrange dental and medical appointments outside school hours when possible.
- Always inform the school if your child is absent due to illness – this should be followed up with a written note when your child returns to school.
- Take truancy seriously if your child is not attending school as you expect they may be putting themselves at risk – Who are they with? What are they doing?
- Take family holidays outside term time.
- Talk to your child about school and take an interest in their school work (including homework).
- Attend parent evenings and school events.
- Praise and reward your child's achievements at school.
- Always support school staff in their efforts to control difficult or challenging behaviour.
- Discuss any problems or difficulties with the school staff are there to help and will be supportive.

- You can demonstrate your commitment to your child's education by not taking holidays during term time. Any child or young person who is absent from school due to a holiday will miss out on important learning and will fall behind with their school work.
- In each Academic Year there are only a maximum of 190 statutory school days – this allows plenty of time for holidays to be arranged outside term time.
- Holidays taken during term time will be categorised as an unauthorised absence.
